Pass the Card

In God's big story, He worked through unlikely people to accomplish His plan and defeat an army with 900 chariots! How do you think God can work through each person in your family to do big things?

Give each person in your family an index card or a half sheet of paper and have them write their names at the top. Then pass your cards to the person on your right and write (or draw) one way God can work through that person at school, home, work, or in your neighborhood. (For example, he might encourage a colleague with a kind email or a classmate by sitting with her at lunch.) Encourage family members to think about each person's gifts and the things they are good at as they write on their cards. After two minutes, pass the cards to the right and repeat the process until the owner of the card gets it back. Take time to read each card aloud and share the things you see in each other—the gifts and circumstances in each person's life that God can work through.



Trash to Treasure

This week's Wonder Truth is God Can Work through Unlikely People. Sometimes it feels hard to even imagine that God would ask us to do something. We might not feel capable enough to do it, or what He asks might seem too hard. We might even be afraid we will mess it up. But that's not how God sees us. He loves us and chooses unlikely people like us: through Him, we can do things we never thought possible!

Find something in your home to repurpose, like a piece of trash, an old cardboard box, an old juice carton, or a shirt you don't wear. As a family, find a way to take the unlikely piece of trash and repurpose it into something amazing and beautiful—like making a kaleidoscope from a potato chip tube or a bird feeder from an empty bottle and some extra pencils. Consider making it with someone else in mind and giving it to them as a gift, letting God work through you to touch that person's life!
